Enrique Garcia's practice explores the processes that drive erasure, decay, and the replication of form. Engaging with themes of history, colonialism, and the consequences of technology, his work centers on the paradoxical relationship between creation and destruction.

His photographic compositions combine disparate found materials to construct networks of symbols, recontextualized through scale and juxtaposition. Drawing from a wide range of references — ancient ruins, celestial objects, and modern technologies — Garcia's work evokes the sublime while prompting reflection on the meaning of human progress.

Garcia studied Sculpture at Pratt Institute. He has participated in fellowships at Lighthouse Works (Fishers Island, NY) and Triangle Arts (Brooklyn, NY). His work has been exhibited at Microscope (New York), Aro (Mexico City), and SculptureCenter (New York).

He lives and works between New York and Mexico City.
